## October 2011 A.D. -- Thoughts From the Pastor

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ Jesus:

A phone call we received at home around 11:00 p.m. on Wednesday, September 15, 2011, changed what I was working on for this issue of "Thoughts From The Pastor". The phone call was not unexpected, but it came when we were already asleep.

This was not the first, nor will it be the last, phone call we receive of this type. I am sure that many of you have received a phone call similar to the one we received. My cousin Vicky's husband Don called to let me know that my Uncle Kenny Flath had died about 20 minutes before.

No matter when you receive the news of the death of a loved one or someone close to you, or when you are there with them when they die, there seems to be an instant void in your life. There are now no more times to visit with that person, phone them, send them a card, or pray for them. We certainly want to continue to pray for their family and loved ones at this time of their loss.

What made this phone call even harder for me to receive was that Uncle Kenny was also my godfather, my sponsor from my baptism as an infant. As my sponsor, he did those things that a sponsor intends to gladly and willingly do with the help of the Lord God. Over the last few months he continued to be concerned about my faith in Jesus Christ. Now he was also asking about how I was doing as your pastor, as pastor of St. Timothy Lutheran Church.

I knew that his death was near as I spoke with him the day before [Tuesday]. He was getting very weak and sounded tired, but his mind was still very sharp. We spoke a bit about the Lord Jesus and then we said what turned out to be our final good-byes this side of heaven.

After telling me how Uncle Kenny's last hours went, Don told me that he died peacefully. *"He's now in heaven with Jesus!"*, Don boldly stated. That was the good news that I needed to hear once again! For Jesus Himself promises, *"Be faithful unto death, and I will give you the crown of life... The one who conquers will not be hurt by the second death"*. [Revelation 2:10b,11b] That's the good news that we all need to hear each and every day.

My Uncle Kenny is now in heaven. He joins all those who have died over the years who believe in Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior. Listen to what you and I are to doing now and in the days ahead. *"Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith..."* [Hebrews 12:1-2a]

By God's grace through faith, today you and I believe that Jesus loves us and all people and that Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior. Therefore, may the Holy Spirit help us speak encouraging and comforting words about Jesus to each other today and in every situation of life. The peace of Jesus be with you all!

May the love of the Lord Jesus always be in your hearts!

# Preschool Happenings

## October 2011



Our preschool students have settled in to the class routine with ease and enthusiasm. We have a great group of nine children in a combined Pre-K and Preschool class. Miss Becky is our teacher with Miss Cindy's assistance. The class schedule is Monday, Wednesday, and Friday mornings. I am in and out of the preschool office on class days, until 2:00 p.m. and in the office on Tuesday and Thursday from 9:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m. This schedule will continue until God blesses us with increased enrollment, and I am teaching. Please share our Preschool ministry with people that God puts in your lives.

This month the children will learn about the small world of creepy-crawly Bugs & Insects. Our special events in October include a fire drill and our second field trip. We are going to *Bob's Corn* in Snohomish and we'll take a hayride to the pumpkin field where we will pick pumpkins and gourds, and wind through the corn maze. Before leaving the farm the children will ride the *Cow Train* and enjoy their snack.

In addition to the world of God's multi-legged creepers, the children will be learning about God's servants Abraham, Jacob, Moses, and Joshua, and how they too can be servants for God, to their family and each other. The students have enjoyed the weekly chapel with Pastor Flath. Chapel is on Wednesday at 11:15 a.m. – right after the Wednesday Bible study group. All members of Saint Timothy are encouraged to join the children in a short lesson.

There will not be a on October 19<sup>th</sup> because preschool staff will be attending the Early Childhood Leadership Seminar in Seaside, Oregon on that day. We will return on Thursday and have a "teacher in service day" on Friday, October 21<sup>st</sup>.

JULY - Twin bed sheets.

NOVEMBER - Food to restock shelves after Thanksgiving, at food bank.
