## Pastor's Thoughts on the Passing Times

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I'm still in this stage of life where my friends are getting married. In fact, I am part of a wedding party at the start of June. To be honest, I thought the number of weddings I'm asked to attend or be a part of would slow down after my generation(millennials) started to reach our 30s. Yet, that is not the case. I still have many friends who are not married and, according to studies of my generation, it's not surprising. From a Pew Research study in 2019 only 44% of millennials (people born between the 1980s & late 1990s) were married. Less than any generation prior. While in 2023 the number has increased, it is not going up fast. But combine that with what you likely know about divorce rates and birth rates, then add the different views of sexuality and gender in American culture, we get an increasingly different picture of our communities that prior generations have not seen or experienced. Two parent families with children used to be a dime a dozen 50, 25, maybe even 15 years ago. Today, our mission field consists of more single people, more DINKs(Dual-Income-No-Kids), more single parents, more of both fathers and mothers working, and more children raised by institutions(day-cares, schools, sports, extra-curriculars etc.) rather than their parents.

As Christians, this information can likely make us upset, and we're even tempted to vent our frustrations. We may want to lament what used to be and even seek to encourage old traditional values to take place once more. Or perhaps we want to ignore the situations entirely, and "live and let live." These things are unhelpful. The reality is the makeup of our communities is drastically different and our ministry to these people must be drastically different and engaging. Complaining or enforcing a bygone era helps no one. Nor does ignoring the situation all together. But that does not mean we water down, or turn away from the good will, order and purpose God established for men and women in the creation. For even the early church dealt with all kinds of notions of marriage, sexuality, and gender identity in pagan Rome. What we need is a return to a robust understanding of God's created work, what he declared to be "very good" and awesome creation. A creation He loved and prepared for human creatures to inhabit. One in which His own Son became incarnate, a creature Himself, to take back a broken world and reclaim it for His Father. We need to reinvigorate our understanding of the image of God placed on His prized creatures in man and woman who are redeemed by the blood of the Son of God who became man Himself.

Over the summer, St. Timothy will have the opportunity to go back to the foundation of God's creation and who He created men and women to be. In this study, we may be tearing down some old presuppositions and idols that are not Biblical but rather human traditions. We will explore the order of creation and what we believe from Scriptures according to God's will on topics such as the place of singleness in the community of the church, the ever-popular topic on the ordination of women, sexuality, divorce, marriage, and the roles and responsibilities of each vocation. It's a necessary topic, and I encourage you all to join and participate with your questions. The class will be on Wednesday evenings at 7PM over the summer from June 28 to August 30. Please consider joining and growing in God's wisdom. Lastly, may God continue to bless your callings in life and be strengthened by His gifts in Word and Sacrament.

KFUO.org is a non-commercial AM radio station owned and operated by The Lutheran Church–Missouri Synod (LCMS). It has a Christian talk and teaching radio format. KFUO is one of the oldest continuous operating Christian radio stations in the United States, with its first broadcast on October 26, 1924; 98 years ago.

### <u> Jewel International Christian School – Christian Missions at St. Timothy</u>

In March I had the opportunity to go back to Juaben, Ghana to see how things were going at Jewel International Christian School (JICS), the school I had worked with until Covid shut things down. The enrollment has increased and is now around 300, which includes students from 3-year-olds to grade 8. It was wonderful to see that each class learns a Bible verse each week and regularly hears Bible stories and the teachers gather twice a week for prayer and devotion time. Academics are also going well.

While I was there, I got to tell the Bible story at their Friday worship time, do some professional development with the teachers, and talk and sing with the students. Since English is the official language of Ghana it is used in the school, but my pronunciation is different than theirs so it took just a little bit for us to understand each other. They also enjoyed quizzing me to see what Twi (their language) words I knew.

The headmaster, Ernest, expressed his gratitude *often* for the supplies I was able to take over for the school, some of which came from St. Timothy members. The money we collected in the mission offering for JICS did not arrive before I left, but I told them it would be coming and he asked me to thank



you for that. Many of you also prayed for me and I thank you for that very important contribution. I heard many stories of God's provision of basic necessities for people which reminded me not to limit my expectations of God nor forget to thank Him and give Him all glory.




